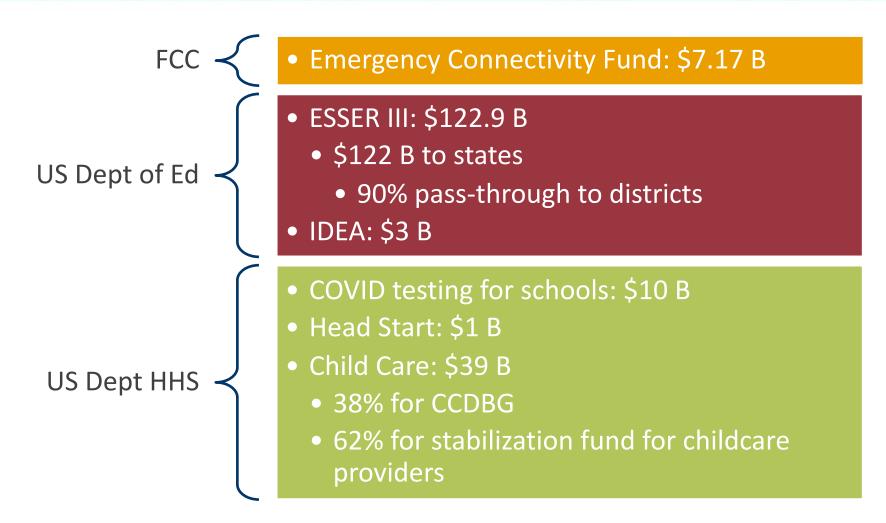

## FCC: Emergency Connectivity Fund



#### **Purpose**

Provide connectivity for students OFF-CAMPUS who do not have a connection



#### **Allowable Products**

Those things that enable you to connect to the internet, which includes connected devices



#### **Funding**

Matching funds NOT required

Limits are set by the FCC

- \$400 per connected device (e.g., laptop, tablet)
- \$250 per hotspot device



## ESSER III National Look (also known as ARP ESSER)

NATIONAL: \$122.8 B

#### **Required Uses**

- \$122 B to States
- \$800 M to support homeless children and youth

STATES: \$122.0 B

#### **Required Uses**

- 90% (\$109.8 B) to School Districts
- 5% Learning Loss
- 1% Summer Enrichment
- 1% Afterschool Programs
- 2.5% Other State Activities
- 0.5% State Admin

DISTRICTS: \$109.8 B

#### **Required Uses**

- 20% Learning Loss
- 80% Allowable Expenses



## Iowa Allocation of ESSER III

### **DMPS Allocation of ESSER III**

- District allocation based on Title I, Part A
  - Title I, Part A calculated on number of <u>eligible</u> school-age students in a district
    - Eligible students include: students from low-income families, who are homeless, in foster care
  - Districts serving larger numbers of Title I eligible students receive more ARP funds
- Supplement not Supplant is NOT applicable

Allocation 1: - Remaining Reimbursement 1	June 1	\$43,068,422

## Addressing Learning Loss

- 20% of allocation (minimum) must be used for evidence-based interventions to address leaning loss
  - Evidence-based as defined by Section 8101(21)(A) of ESEA, as amended by ESSA
    - 4 Tiers: Strong, Moderate, Promising, Demonstrates a Rationale
- Examples:
  - Summer learning or summer enrichment
  - Extended day
  - Comprehensive afterschool programs
  - Extended school year programs
- DMPS: \$18.45 M



## Remaining 80% of Allocation

#### DMPS: \$73.82 M on "allowable expenses"

• July 2021 through September 2024

#### Allowable Expenses are broad, with substantial local authority

- Any activity authorized by ESEA, IDEA, Adult Education and Family Literacy, Carl Perkins
- Response to and prepare for the coronavirus
- Unique needs of sub-populations of students (e.g., low income)
- Facility sanitization and cleaning
- Improvements to reduce virus transmission (e.g, improve indoor air quality / HVAC)
  - Prior state approval for greater than \$5,000
- Technology expenses, including hardware, software, connectivity
- Mental health services and support
- Maintain operation and continuity of services
- Maintain equity for high-poverty schools



## **Prior Approval Required**

- Expenses greater than \$5,000 require prior approval from Iowa DE
  - Example: HVAC / air quality projects will require prior approval required



## Strategies for Use of ARP ESSER III Funds (part I)

### **Overarching**

- All ESSER III funds will be tracked separately
- Cross-functional working groups and communications channels utilized to coordinate plans, goals, priorities, major initiatives, programs and projects
- Develop a three-year plan



## Strategies for Use of ARP ESSER III Funds (part 2)

#### **Prioritize Investments**

- Focus on a few high-leverage investments
- Addressing learning loss/unfinished learning
- Addressing students social/emotional needs
- Safe operation of schools during virus spread, including facility improvements

#### **Equity Focus**

- Investment opportunities evaluated through an equity lens that benefits students most in need of intensive support or intervention
- Prioritize investments aligned to addressing unfinished learning in an equitable manner that differentiates allocations based on student need



## Strategies for Use of ARP ESSER III Funds (part 3)

#### Avoid a Funding Cliff

• Pitfall of utilizing non-recurring revenue to support on-going recurring costs with no plan for an offsetting reduction in expenditures to coincide with the revenue end date

#### Plan for Sustainability

- Use this one-time funding for non-recurring needs
- Use this one-time funding to build a foundation for sustainable student growth
- Investments are either sustainable beyond the grant period expiration or deliberately made with a defined life cycle up front
